From the Pulpit

What Will We Offer Jesus?

Every Sunday, there's a lot going on during the collection of offerings that is cloaked in mystery. We really don't know how *many* people give. We don't know how *much* everyone gives. But one thing that is NOT a mystery is this: our *motive* is as clear as the light of Christ shining into our hearts (1 John 1:5). Giving an offering to Jesus fills us with joy!

What will we offer Jesus? How about our best! Sure, we could hastily grab a buck or two out of our pockets and purses. But carefully read these two stanzas from a well-known hymn:

"We give Thee but thine own, Whate'er the gift may be; All that we have is thine alone, a trust, O Lord, from thee.

May we thy bounties thus As stewards true receive And gladly, as thou blessest us, To thee our firstfruits give."

(CW 485, st. 1-2)

God's gift to us is ... us. "All that we have" includes everything: our bodies and souls, eyes, ears and all our members, our minds and all our abilities, our time and treasures. It's simply an acknowledgment that "all that we have is thine alone!"

What will we offer Jesus who offered his all? Shall I offer Jesus my heart? YES! Instead of worrying how much is just enough to give to Jesus, perhaps it would be best if we stop, listen, and simply receive, through faith, the gifts of Jesus. God—here, now—:

- announces his good news to you: your scarlet sins will be white as snow!
- proclaims peace between you and God, in spite of you!
- brings your good tidings through his body and blood for your forgiveness.
- proclaims his salvation to you: The Lord has given us his Son. The Lord has given us forgiveness. He gives us his heaven!

What will we offer Jesus? How about this: "gladly as thou blessest us, too thee our firstfruits give." May our dear Lord Jesus bless and give you a gladness in giving! And may his blessing go with you as you share the Light of the World with those in the darkness all around you!

Deuteronomy 8:10-18

God's Turn to Teach

¹⁰ When you have eaten and are satisfied, praise the LORD your God for the good land he has given you. ¹¹ Be careful that you do not forget the LORD your God, failing to observe his commands, his laws and his decrees that I am giving you this day. ¹² Otherwise, when you eat and are satisfied, when you build fine houses and settle down, ¹³ and when your herds and flocks grow large and your silver and gold increase and all you have is multiplied, ¹⁴ then your heart will become proud and you will forget the LORD your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery. ¹⁵ He led you through the vast and dreadful desert, that thirsty and waterless land, with its venomous snakes and scorpions. He brought you water out of hard rock. ¹⁶ He gave you manna to eat in the desert, something your fathers had never known, to humble and to test you so that in the end it might go well with you. ¹⁷ You may say to yourself, "My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me." ¹⁸ But remember the LORD your God, for it is he who gives you the ability to produce wealth, and so confirms his covenant, which he swore to your forefathers, as it is today.
