C18 Advent resources are available for free download:

A newly composed **gathering rite** and thematic **Verses of the Day**. Both use the tune VENI EMMANUEL. Each Sunday begins with the first stanza of "Oh, Come, Oh, Come, Emmanuel" along with a newly written stanza that highlights the day's theme. The appropriate Advent wreath candles are lighted during the gathering rite.

Musical arrangements and new texts for the gathering rite and Verses of the Day are by Jeremy S. Bakken, a published composer and Director of Worship and Sacred Music at Northwestern Publishing House. **WELS congregations are granted permission to use these copyrighted resources.** All other uses require additional permission. For the gathering rite two accompaniment options are available. File names that include "with hymnal" indicate versions that are slightly easier than the other versions. This is especially the case in the piano versions.

¹ Accompanists who find it difficult to follow both the musical score and the text may write some cue phrases into the score.

² To avoid fuzzy graphics in Word, search for help on "turn off picture compression". The TIFF files are 1200 dpi resolution. If converting from Word to PDF causes fuzzy graphics, help is available online. For example: https://superuser.com/questions/645657/export-word-document-with-high-resolution-png-to-pdf. Other solutions are available when converting from Publisher to PDF. (Solutions are not identical for Windows and Mac computers.)
