UNEXPECTED EVANGELISTS

THE APOSTLE PAUL

- Three (perhaps four) missionary journeys
- · Founded dozens of congregations
- Instrumental in taking the gospel to the Gentiles
- · Wrote 13 books of the New Testament
- · Suffered over and over as a result of his evangelism
- · Was martyred as a result of his evangelism

What made him such an unlikely evangelist? Discuss with those around you.

If Paul was such an unlikely evangelist, how did he become one? Discuss with those around you.

Why did Jesus choose Paul to serve as an evangelist? Discuss with those around you.

Pause the video while breakout groups discuss. Group share. Then resume video.

Paul's confession

I Timothy 1:13-16

YOU

Why would you not naturally be Jesus' first choice to serve as an evangelist? Discuss with those around you.

Pause the video and discuss as a group. Once the group identifies our sin and natural alienation from God, resume video.

Romans 3:10-12

So...why did Jesus choose you to become his evangelist?

Titus 3:4

2 Corinthians 5:14, 20

What fears about evangelism do those realities address? Discuss with those around you.

Pause the video while breakout groups discuss. Group share. Then resume video.

- "I don't deserve to tell others."
- "I don't know enough to tell others."
- "I'm a sinner too. So, who am I to tell people how to live?"
- "This person could never be brought to faith."

EVANGELISM IS...

How do you define "evangelism"?

Pause the video while breakout groups discuss. Group share. Then resume video.

Evangelism = εὐαγγέλιον = "good news"

What is the good news we have to tell?

Pause the video while breakout groups discuss. Group share. Then resume video.

Luke 2:10.11 A Savior has been born

Matthew 1:21 He has saved people from their sins

Romans 6:23 The gift of God is eternal life

The gospel of Jesus Christ is the <u>good news</u> that Jesus has <u>saved</u> us from our <u>sins</u> and gives us <u>eternal life in heaven</u>.

Evangelism = Connecting people (especially those who don't know the good news) to the gospel

HOW DO WE DO EVANGELISM?

Two ways of connecting people to the gospel

- 1. Invitation
- 2. Proclamation

Is invitation or proclamation a better way to connect people to the gospel?

Pause the video while breakout groups discuss. Group share. Then resume video.

When do we do evangelism?

2 Timothy 4:2 In season and out of season

What are some situations that it might be "in season" and "out of season" to spread the gospel?

Pause the video while breakout groups discuss. Group share. Then resume video.

In season

- A coworker asks where you attend church
- Someone next to you on a flight notices you are reading a Christian book and asks about it
- A neighbor at a barbeque asks if you think there is such a thing as life after death

Out of season

- Coworker asks why you're a Christian as you are rushing out the door at the end of the day
- A person next to you on a flight asks about Christianity but you are tired and would rather sleep
- Your roommate mocks Christianity

FOR NEXT TIME
