


PHILEMON AND ONESIMUS

Philemon 1-25

God chose a man named Paul to follow him and to teach people about his Son Jesus. Paul had a friend named Philemon, who believed in Jesus and opened his home to others so they could learn about the Savior. Philemon had slaves who worked for him. One day one of his slaves ran away. This slave's name was Onesimus.

After running away, Onesimus found Paul. Paul told Onesimus that God loved him so much that he sent his Son Jesus to die on a cross to pay for all the wrong things he had done. Onesimus was sorry that he had run away. When he learned how much Jesus loved him, he wanted to tell Philemon he was sorry and return to him as a faithful slave.

Paul wrote a letter to his friend Philemon. In it he told Philemon that his slave Onesimus now believed in God, and he was sorry for running away. Paul asked Philemon to accept Onesimus back no longer as a slave but as a brother in Christ. Paul expected Philemon to take Onesimus back because Philemon knew God had forgiven him just like he had forgiven Onesimus.





PARENTS AND KIDS:
